Participants Needed for Research Study – University of Leeds

We're looking for children and young people aged 12–21 years with Hemiplegic Cerebral Palsy to take part in an exciting study exploring how Transcutaneous Spinal Cord Stimulation (tSCS) could help improve arm and hand movements.

Who can join?

- Age: 12-21 years
- Diagnosis: Hemiplegic Cerebral Palsy
- Able to use hands in daily activities
- Stable health (no heart/lung problems, no seizures)
- **Exclusions:** Epilepsy, implanted devices, recent fractures, or recent clinical trial participation.

5tudy Details

- 2 sessions on separate days (each 60–90 mins)
- Includes warm-up, resistance-based exercises, and cool-down
- Randomised: one session with tSCS, one with training only
- Travel to University of Leeds required

Participants Needed for Research Study

Title of Project:

The Effects of Transcutaneous Spinal Cord Stimulation (tSCS) on Upper Extremity Function in Children and Young People with Hemiplegic Cerebral Palsy

Study Goal:

We want to find out if stimulating the spinal cord with a low current can help improve arm and hand movements in children and young people with cerebral palsy. This electrical stimulation activates nerves to help them send signals to the muscles, and potentially improving arm and hand movements

Who Can Join?

- Age: Children and young people aged 12 to 21 years.
- Diagnosis: children and young people with Hemiplegic Cerebral Palsy.
- · Hand function: Having difficulties using their hands in daily activities.
- Stable Health: Stable health conditions (no heart or lung problems, no seizures).
- Exclusions: Severe health issues (e.g., high blood pressure, cancer, untreated infections); neurological disorders (e.g., epilepsy: personal/family history); implanted devices (e.g., pacemakers); Botox injections in upper limb muscles (past 6 months); recent surgeries (past year) that could affect participation; ongoing complications (e.g., unhealed fractures, contractures); clinical research participation (past 3 months).

Study Details

- The study includes 2 sessions on separate days.
 - Each session lasts 60 to 90 minutes.
- You will take part in two sessions:
 - one involving training alone and one involving training combined with transcutaneous spinal cord stimulation (tSCS)
 - . The order is randomised (some start with tSCS, others with Training Only)
- Each session includes:
 - . A Baseline Assessment (at the start of the session)
 - Either tSCS + Training or Training Only (depending on the session)
 - A Post Assessment (immediately after training)

The training will be adapted to suit your abilities. It will include warm-up exercises, practical tasks like gripping or daily activities, resistance-based exercises, and a cool-down period with stretching.

Travel to the University of Leeds required; £20 voucher, travel reimbursement, and parking provided.

Meet Grandad Wheels

Brian Abram is 'Grandad Wheels'

I'm 68, retired and from Halifax. After a serious cycling accident in 2013, I was left paraplegic and a full-time wheelchair user. I started writing stories to amuse my Grandson Charles, but I was encouraged to share them with a wider audience. I have now self-published six books in the series 'The Adventures of Grandad Wheels!' — exciting tales of the crazy things I get up to with my grandson Charles (Charlie in the stories). Each story gives the reader some appreciation of the challenges that face wheelchair users. But the main objective is to show that a Grandad in a wheelchair (or anyone in a wheelchair for that matter) can still have a whole lot of fun!

All the proceeds from my books are donated to charity, divided equally between the **Spinal Injuries Association** and **Back Up**. Both these charities work to improve the lives of people like me who have suffered a spinal injury. I've now raised **£90,000**.

As at September 2025, I've visited **200 schools** and met almost **40,000 children**. I raise awareness of the challenges disabled people face whilst entertaining the children and encouraging them to interact with me in a fun way.

It is an afternoon of live music with real bands in a real gig venue. Made with Music prides itself on being inclusive and accessible and want more families to be able to attend live music events.

Here are **some** of the things they do to make their gigs accessible:

- Changing places trailer at each event (an accessible toilet with changing bench, hoist and attendant)
- Pre-information available including a photo guide
- Access to the space before the event to check it out
- Clear signage around the building
- Strict timings which are available before the event
- Level access, suitable for wheelchairs
- Variety of seating available (benches, mats, chairs, beanbags)
- Black out tent if you need to dampen all other senses but still want to listen to the music
- Ear defenders available to borrow
- Friendly staff around the room to answer any questions you have
- We keep some tickets back for families who can't decide until the day
- Offer a "Pay if you stay" ticket on the door if you want to try the gig but for any reason you
 or your young person can't stay for the whole thing.



Specialist Support

We understand that all learners' skills and needs vary and recognise that it is likely that learners will need a higher level of support throughout their lives. Foundation Studies benefits from a specialist 'Care Team' who support learners with varying levels of personal and medical care.

Students will also be allocated smaller class sizes and a personal tutor who will provide them with pastoral support, information advice and guidance and help them to progress through their learning journey.

Highlights of our Ofsted report include:

- Learners with special educational needs and/or disabilities are well supported by qualified staff.
- Learners with high needs benefit from inclusive and personalised learning pathways which enable them to develop their knowledge and skills alongside their resilience and their independence. Consequently, they are prepared well for further study or employment, including supported internships.
- Learners with profound multiple learning disabilities receive well-coordinated specialist support, including speech and language therapy, physiotherapy and occupational therapy, that meets their needs and enables them to engage fully in their learning.

What will the course offer?

Our curriculum is split into strands of support with a bite size curriculum offer. The key strands are:

Independent Living and Community Inclusion

A skill-based curriculum that allows you to develop a sense of who you are, whilst experiencing the wider community. Develop your basic cooking skills, learn household tasks, take part in enrichment events, manage a personal budget, and develop your communication skills for personal and social development.

Work/Employment
